#### Safety, Rules, and Regulations - Bill Breslau

 Report regarding 80 Spring Hill Road property search revealed four lots were sold prior to the Witches Woods Tax District; it appears 80 Spring Hill was included in this sale and therefore is not part of the district and does not owe taxes. Information provided by the Attorney confirms this

#### Roads - Ray Bonneau

- Two piles of aggregate were delivered by John Albrecht at the cost of about \$1000. It will be used to fix potholes as they appear, maintaining the roads throughout the season.
- John Albrecht is requesting payment for supplies acquired for the spring repair of Crooked Trail Extension

- Plow driver plowed road to beach on Indian Spring Road to allow fire truck access to the dry hydrant
- Roads are still in good condition, but a few areas of concern will be closely monitored, Ray will
  continue to fill potholes as they arise

## **Communications - Phyllis Bonneau**

- Website is up to date
- Email was sent regarding bear prints found on Crooked Trail beach (information) and tax bills due date

#### **Treasurer - Tony Paradiso**

- CD matured, and was rolled over
- Board discusses delinquent taxes and approach to address the issue
- New tax payments have begun moving in

#### **New Business – Mike Moran**

- Mike Moran was not present at this meeting, he forwarded information to board members to be addressed at the meeting.
- Board members discussed the current issue of the District tax collector resigning. Bill offers to research/approach a potential candidate, Mike Moran also forwarded the name of a party who may be interested.
- Board discussed options for controlling the geese population as this was a concern brought forth by a resident. John will continue to research the options as well as contact Bungee regarding any steps they may have taken to address the same issue.
- Board discussed a resident's concerns regarding the blight/health condition of specific property in the District and what measures, if any, might be appropriate at this point.
- Board discussed residents' concerns regarding animals on resident property within the Tax
  District. The rules of the lake specifically state animals not for commercial use. In addition, any
  rules regarding animals must follow state regulations for minimum land requirements. For
  example: animals such as goats, horses or cows would not be permitted as no lots within the
  district are large enough to satisfy state guidelines.
- The board discussed the recent tree that fell on Indian Spring, the emergency clearing of the roadway and that restoration of power has been completed. The remaining debris as left by the power company is the responsibility of the homeowner.
- Board discussed the work of our new contractor for plowing/sanding. With only one storm so far
  this season, the general consensus is positive with some concerns for sanding/ice. The board
  will continue to monitor the quality of the work and weigh resident feedback/concerns with any
  upcoming storms.
